



2021-22 Universal Risk Assessment

Goal: Identify high-risk LEAs for intensive on-site collaborative monitoring



2021-22 Universal Risk Assessment

- Risk is evaluated to determine the chance of an adverse impact of an LEA achieving grant and compliance requirements.
- The 2021-22 Universal Risk Assessment analyzes quantifiable data points/indicators and risk criteria levels to determine a total risk score for each LEA.
- The LEA's total risk score will used to determine if Tier 3 intensive on-site collaborative monitoring will be conducted by a team comprised of ALL ESEA federal programs.


Common across all participating programs

- All LEA program-level uploads are due by the last day of each of the four designated upload months.
- Upload months are October, November, February and March.

Program Monitoring Tier 1: October Uploads

Identification and Enrollment:

 LEA identify students experiencing homeless and immediately enrolling in them in school

> ESEA Sections 722(g)(6)(A), 722(g)(3)(D) and (G), 722(g)(3)(C)(iii))



Program Monitoring Tier 1: October Uploads

Identification and Enrollment:

 Immediate enrollment for students experiencing homelessness when immunizations or other required health records not available

ESEA Section 722(g)(3)(C)(iii)



Program Monitoring Tier 1: October Uploads

Identification and Enrollment:

- Maintenance of relevant student records
- Records made available in a timely fashion when a child enrolls in a new school or school district
- Living situations treated as student record and not directory information

ESEA Section 722(g)(3)(D) and (G)



Program Monitoring Tier 1

Identification and Enrollment:

- Liaison ensures identification and enrollment in a timely manner in coordination with school personnel and other agencies and organizations
- MVA definition of enrolled: attending classes and participating fully in school activities




Title IX, Part A October Uploads

Documentation:

- Student Housing (Residency) Questionnaire in enrollment packet or screenshot of online enrollment form
- Samples of referral forms or emails to obtain immunization or physicals or immunizations or other health records

2020-21 Monitoring

- Review in progress
- Will not overlap 2021-22 monitoring
- Addresses activities during the 2020-21 fiscal year (July 1, 2020–June 30, 2021)
- Includes targeted desktop (1 LEA) and selfmonitoring (all other LEAs)



2020-21 Monitoring

- Targeted desktop includes:
 - Submission of required documents (sample)
- Self-monitoring includes:
 - Review of required documents
 - No submission of documents
 - Submit to <u>flmvp@fldoe.org</u>:
 - Confirm completion of document review
 - Indicate areas out of compliance



2021-24 Applications

- 54 applications submitted
- 100% of applications have been reviewed
- Funding list routing for approval
- Budgets have been submitted for fiscal review
- Anticipate announcement date is August 31, 2021



American Rescue Plan Homeless Children and Youth

- FDOE submitted the application for Homeless II funding
- State Plan due to U.S. Department of Education by September 7, 2021
- FDOE anticipates release of Request for Application (RFA) by Fall 2021
